SJSON Campus Safety and Culture Survey – Spring 2024**

**Survey Data Report Summary
Response Rate and Survey Demographics**

St Joseph School of Nursing (SJSON) is committed to ensuring that all students have the opportunity to attend school without the threat of sexual harassment, violence or discrimination. Recognizing that sexual misconduct can impact a student’s academic performance and emotional and/or physical welfare, and in compliance with New Hampshire State law RSA 188-H:4, students enrolled at SJSON were invited to participate in the bi-annual SJSON Campus Safety and Culture Survey. Students were notified of the survey multiple times prior to the start of the survey via announcements through the school portal and campus posters. The feedback from this survey will be used to help maintain student safety at SJSON as well as all NH college campuses.

The Spring 2024 SJSON Campus Safety and Culture Survey was released via survey monkey from February 8, 2024 to March 4, 2024. The survey was sent to 101 students and 42 students responded. The response rate was 41.6%.

Some of the responses noted in the following tables might vary because there are specific questions that participants with a ‘no’ response are instructed to skip the remaining questions in that section. In addition, participants could choose to skip questions or exit the survey at any time.

Table 1 addresses key demographic characteristics of survey respondents. 46% of students at SJSON are over age 30. 66% of students gender identify as women. 56% of students identify as white with 20% identifying as black or African American and 10% as Hispanic. 12% of students preferred not to answer the question about race/ethnicity. 80% of students identify as heterosexual with 5% identifying as gay and 5% as bisexual. 10% of students preferred to not answer the question regarding sexual orientation.
